PARK ACCESS

Phase 1 - Monday 11th July
Tramlines Festival build commences.
Large portions of the north section of the park are not accessible from this point, including the car park accessed from Parkside Road. To the south, HASA's football pitches also aren't available. The middle section in blue remains open to the public but with controlled work areas until Phase 2 begins.

Phase 2 - Monday 18th July Most of Hillsborough Park is inaccessible until after the event.

The pathway linking Broughton Road to Middlewood Road is kept open for as long as possible but is eventually closed Wednesday 20th - Tuesday 26th July inclusive.

Thursday 28th July

The blue section opens to the public again.



RE-ENTRY

Please be aware that there is no readmission to Tramlines Festival after entry, so please plan ahead!

As with our previous editions, in line with our 2021 Gold Status award from Attitude is Everything, access customers will be able to make specific arrangements with the Access Manager should they need to leave and re enter the festival. You can contact them by emailing: access@tramlines.org.uk.

Those with unforeseen or emergency circumstances during the weekend should speak to staff at the Customer Service tent. The Customer Service Team will also make arrangements for parents who need to take children home and wish to return to site on their own later.

Families don't need to get in touch ahead of the event to make re-entry arrangements, however we do understand some residents may have queries so please get in touch on residents@tramlines.org.uk and not through our access email address.

Please be aware, those permitted to re-enter the festival will be able to do so once, subject to the same entrance procedures as first arrival and will have to be back on site before the gates close for all ticket holders at 19:30.

NOISE

We are committed to ensuring that noise from Tramlines is controlled to within the limits agreed with the local authority. Our team of external noise consultants, Joynes Nash, were appointed to work on Tramlines to develop a noise management plan, aiming to minimise noise nuisance for local residents and monitor noise levels throughout the show weekend.

This enables the festival to measure the noise that is leaving the festival from the main stages' PA systems to check how sound is behaving in the area.

Sound check noise isn't continuous but rather an occasional checking of levels within the defined period of time.

ROAD CLOSURES FOR PEDESTRIAN SAFETY

Please see the table below for estimated road closure times. Due to possible schedule changes at the event, these are only estimates:

This means access to Middlewood Rd for anyone, including residents, will be paused during this time for approximately 1 hour 15 minutes each night with Penistone Road also being closed each night for approximately 45 minutes

Please note in emergency situations, or if it is required, any or all of the roads contained within the TTRO can be closed at any time if it is deemed essential for the safety of attendees, residents or any other persons.

SECURITY

We have been working closely with South Yorkshire Police and the local licensing authority to ensure that we have suitable support during the event. Tramlines will continue to endeavour to limit the impact on the surrounding community.

SANITATION

We will have toilet provision on entry/exit gates and will deploy security to streets that had previous issues with attendees urinating as attendees arrive and leave the event.

We've increased our dedicated litter picking team for 2022 to cleanse the park, surrounding streets and egress routes.

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RESIDENT STREET ACCESS

A Temporary Traffic Regulation Order (TTRO) will be implemented on the streets shown in the map on the right in order to:

- Deter attendees from parking in the direct vicinity of the park
- Lower volumes of traffic
- Improve public and attendee safety

Access will be maintained for residents, business owners, their employees and customers.

A Resident Access Hanger has been included with this information sheet. This hanger will need to be displayed in your vehicle to enable access to your address. Please be aware that these hangers are not parking permits and are for access to your streets only.

Each property will automatically receive one hanger per household, if there is more than one vehicle registered to your address please email residents@tramlines.org.uk to request further hangers. Please note you will need to provide proof of address in order to qualify.
