RESIDENT PARKING & TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT

We implement a residents-only parking scheme to:

- Prevent attendees from parking in the direct vicinity of the park.
- Lower volumes of traffic.
- Improve public and attendee safety.

How customers arrived in 2021:

- Walk 29%
- Public Transport 25%
- Dropped Off 32%
- Drive 14%

*Based on surveys of 3000 attendees.

2022 Resident Parking Scheme

This year we will continue to operate the same parking scheme as 2021 by sending out Resident Access Hangers.

On our post-event survey, Residents rated:

The overall hanger scheme - 4/5 ★★★★★

Process for receiving hangers - 4.2/5 ★★★★★

Delivery of the scheme - 3.9/5: ★★★★★

To regulate the amount of hangers given out, we will send each household within the TTR0 (Temporary Traffic Regulation Order) one hanger and then invite residents to collect any extra hangers they'd like from our Resident Liaison Team from HASA.

To further mitigate against parking on residential roads, we have three 'Official Tramlines Car Parks' available to attendees wishing to drive to the event, the car parks are competitively priced at £7.50 for the day or £20 for the weekend and are listed below:


- Sheffield College

Our communications to customers reinforce the message that parking on residential roads is strictly prohibited and we encourage ticket holders to purchase 'Official Car Park' tickets if they choose to drive.

Signage & Staff

In 2021, we increased our visible presence on surrounding residential streets with signage and marshals to restrict attendees parking on roads outside of the TTR0. Having never done this previously, we thought it worked well as a visual deterrent from unwanted traffic and will be continuing to implement it in 2022.

Road Closures for Pedestrian Safety

To ensure pedestrian safety when exiting the festival, we close Middlewood Rd and Penistone Rd to all traffic each night.

Please see the table below for estimated road closure times for 2022:

	Friday	Saturday	Sunday
Middlewood Rd	21:30 - 22:45	21:30 - 22:45	20:30 - 21:45
Penistone Rd	21:45 - 22:20	21:45 - 22:20	20:45 - 21:40

This means access to Middlewood Rd for anyone, including residents, will be paused during this time for approximately 1 hour 15 minutes each night with Penistone Road also being closed each night for approximately 40 minutes.

Please note in emergency situations, or if it is required, any or all of the roads contained within the TTR0 can be closed at any time if it is deemed essential for the safety of attendees, residents or any other persons.
